

Special Olympics New Zealand Online Registrations Frequently Asked Questions *Updated 15/11/2021*

I submitted the volunteer registration form, when will I be accepted as a volunteer by SONZ?

SONZ is required to submit the prospective volunteer's Police Vetting and Consent forms to the New Zealand Police and wait until the New Zealand Police have notified SONZ that they have been officially vetted. Due to wait times for New Zealand Police vetting this process can take between 1-3 months.

I submitted the athlete registration form, when will I be accepted as an athlete by SONZ?

We aim to accept new athlete registrations within 5 working days. All new registrations are manually checked by a staff member to ensure information and documents submitted meets SONZ requirements. If the information fails to meet requirements the prospective athlete or volunteer will be contacted and asked to submit a new form.

Why didn't I receive a confirmation email after submitting my registration form?

Applicants have the option to receive a PDF copy of their registration form, to do this they must provide an email address, if they have not they will not receive a confirmation email.

Depending on your email service your confirmation email may also be sent to your junk/spam folder.

How do I find out what the athlete/volunteer's membership ID is?

1. Each club will receive an excel document with a copy of current registered athletes with their Membership ID from their Regional Sports Coordinator
2. The athlete and volunteer expiry reports that are sent out monthly by your local Regional Sports Co-Ordinator will also now show the Membership ID.
3. You can also contact your local RSC and they will be able to get it for you.

Club Specific FAQs

How will a club know when a registration has been submitted?

When an applicant submits an online registration form an email containing a PDF copy of their registration form will be sent to the nominated email address(es) of the club they applied for.

Each month your local RSC will be sending through a report of any new athletes/volunteers that has registered with your club so you can track this way as well.

Can a club complete the online registrations on behalf of someone or does it have to be done by the individual / caregiver registering?

It is up to a club how they wish the registrations to work, it can either be done by a member of the club or by the individual being registered. Regional Sports Coordinators are not allowed to do the online registration on a Club's behalf.

Why didn't the club receive a notification email after an volunteer or athlete registration form has been submitted?

SONZ sends automated notification emails to the club's default contact email address as listed on the Join a Club page, or when we have been asked to send it to specific club members. To check which email address is being used for your club contact your local RSC.

Depending on your email service the email may also end up in your junk/spam mail, to prevent this in the future make the emails as 'not spam'.

An unknown person has submitted a volunteer or athlete registration, what do I do?

Clubs do not have to accept unknown registrations, if clubs receive an unknown registration contact your local RSC.

Uploading PDFs to an Online Registration

Converting JPEGs to PDF

Athlete medicals and Police vetting forms are often scanned as images/JPEGs. These need to be converted to a single PDF in order to be uploaded to the online registrations.

You do not need any special software to convert JPEGs to PDFs

How to tell the difference between a JPEG and PDF

You can tell the difference between a JPEG and PDF by checking the file format.

If the file name ends with .jpg it is a JPEG.

If the file ends with .pdf it is a PDF file.
